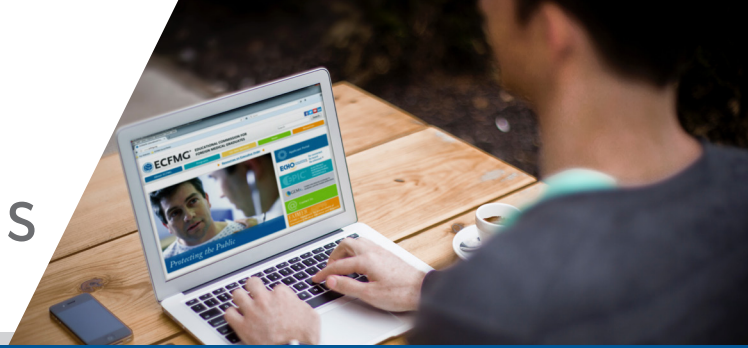

Policies and Procedures on Irregular Behavior

Engaging in "irregular behavior" can end your career before it starts. What is irregular behavior? Sharing test content on the internet, providing false information on your application forms, and taking an exam you're not eligible for are just a few examples. Whether you engage in irregular behavior knowingly or simply because you are unaware of the policies, the consequences are the same and they are serious: you can be barred from ECFMG Certification and other ECFMG services. Also, ECFMG will share information about your behavior with others in the medical education and licensing communities. Don't let this happen to you.

Translation Service

While working toward ECFMG Certification, you will be required to submit certain documents, such as your final medical diploma, to ECFMG. If your document is not in English, it must be accompanied by an English translation that meets ECFMG's translation requirements. **ECFMG strongly encourages you to obtain translations from its recommended translation service, Straker Translations.** Translations from this service meet ECFMG's requirements and will not be rejected due to translation errors.
